

A note from Jo

It seems astonishing that Unity Auckland has been operating for almost 35 years. On the 20th of February in 1989 Nigel Cox and I, with the backing of the founder of Unity Books, Alan Preston, proudly opened the doors of this new kid on the block.

On High Street in its heyday, 'World' had appeared across the road only two doors from the fabulous Rosinis all shiny and new, which dared to feature offal on Fridays and served the best French Fries, often delivered to Unity by Poi. Vivace was open on the second floor on the corner of Vulcan and High, and the Occidental Bar in Vulcan (open since 1870) was dark and small and allowed us to store our alcohol for launches in their deep, supposedly haunted, basement - where there was often an orphaned lamb or two from the owner's farm being quietly cared for in the depths.

Opening Unity in 1989 in High Street was a brave move. Huh! Some competition for the 12 bookstores within a radius of two blocks! Any thoughtful business advisor would have cautioned us against this. But Nigel and I were so certain that Unity had a place in the Auckland literary landscape. Remember, the Writers Festival didn't exist in 1989 and news travelled slowly - by post or fax, so niche authors had tiny fan bases in the distant antipodes. Consequently we were able to have evenings in the store with Richard Ford, Tim Winton, Armistead Maupin, Tom Robbins and Vikram Seth to name a few. No charge - a glass of wine or three with literary superstars.

Over the years, we have seen the heavyweights of the book industry move into Auckland City and then move out. I do admit to a certain amount of apprehension when the mighty Borders set up shop in Queen Street with much hype and excitement. But after a long evening browsing there and not finding a single book worth purchasing (I'm not exaggerating) I realised that New Zealand had been duped.

It was a dumping ground for second rate backlist titles with mass market bestsellers on the front tables. Eventually Borders too admitted defeat and slunk out of town. And fast forward to the end of 2023 and only Whitcoulls in Commercial Bay and Unity on High Street remain in the city, though we should also include the treasure trove that is Jason Second Hand Books on O'Connell.

There's less competition these days, perhaps, but the three years of plagues and flooding have been the toughest yet. As we move into our 36th year, I am overwhelmingly grateful to all of you for making this happen. Your loyalty, kindness, generosity and passion have enabled us not only to survive but thrive.

There is a wealth of fabulous tomes in store so bring on the coming long, hot days and enjoy our selection of Christmas gifts and summer reading.

As the song goes, summertime and the livin' is easy.


